Working with various Roots band line-ups from his Yorkshire base since the late seventies - Des Horsfall has had, in his own words - "a few skirmishes with fame". In the eighties he fronted Blues-Rock band 'Raw Deal' that was managed by Alexis Korner. In the nineteen nineties he was to be seen in hit videos on CMT and as opening act for Joe Ely, Steve Earle and many others. After a decade of studio work at his own analogue recording facility Valve Studios, Horsfall has re-emerged with a brand new 'Rustic Rock n Roll' outfit 'Des Horsfall's Kuschty Rye' and a critically acclaimed (Ronnie Lane inspired) album 'The Good Gentleman's Tonic' - the first in a trilogy mirroring Lane's Slim Chance releases.
